

Seventy nations and territories, representing one-third of the world's population, will participate on a stage where 4,500 athletes will compete in 17 sports, watched by a global audience of 2 billion.

Around 15,000 volunteers and 1,400 staff will work on delivering the Games, with up to 1 million tickets available to the public.

The Games looked for a technology partner that could deliver a stable, end-to-end solution to support the requirements of those involved in the event. The challenges are immense. Everything has to be in place and running seamlessly when the Games start. The IT has to be reliable and highly responsive to deliver a world-class experience to a global audience. Organisers knew they needed an IT solution provider with a great track record in global events, as well as the ability to provide extensive local support.

The Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games chose Dell to provide the infrastructure to ensure the event is a success and leaves a valuable legacy for both Glasgow and Scotland. Everyone involved in the Games will benefit from a reliable technology platform. They will have access to Dell Latitude laptops and Dell OptiPlex desktops with Intel® Core™ processors across all sites, including the Games venues, media centre, athletes' village, volunteer centre and international broadcast centre. Logistics and event management applications will run in two data centres featuring Dell PowerEdge servers with Intel® Xeon® processors running as virtual servers, and Dell EqualLogic and PowerVault storage. Dell KACE Virtual Systems Management Appliances will simplify the configuration and management of the Dell systems and help maximise uptime. Throughout the Games, participants will also get instant support from a Dell-supported help desk at a Technology Operations Centre to answer enquiries and escalate requests.

Planners de-risk event with IT partner practised in global sporting occasions

Event organisers are keeping to schedule as they approach the start of the Games on 23 July, 2014. The final eight weeks of preparation will be the most intensive because this is when the vast majority of Dell technology is due to be deployed at the venues, including the athletes' village. Nourse is highly confident of remaining on track. He says: "The last eight weeks is when the pressure really intensifies. The Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games reinforced the critical role that a technology partner like Dell plays in delivering these global events."

Organisers are also staying focused on delivering a great Games, safe in the knowledge that the Dell infrastructure will remain stable.
